Position

The Global Network of Women Peacebuilders seeks a part-time Peacebuilding Communications Intern for a 6-month period. The Peacebuilding Communications Intern will take part in advocacy, media, and communications work regarding GNWP programs on women's rights, gender equality, conflict prevention, peacebuilding and sustaining peace. The Intern will work principally from New York City or remotely, under the supervision of the Communications Coordinator.

The Organization

The Global Network of Women Peacebuilders (GNWP), is a coalition of women's groups and other civil society organizations from Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Latin America, Eastern and Western Europe, Middle East and the Arab world—mostly in conflict-affected countries—that are actively involved in advocacy and action for the full and effective implementation of the UN Security Council Resolutions (UNSCR) on women and peace and security.

GNWP aims to amplify women's voices for a more sustainable and inclusive peace. To achieve this aim, GNWP engages in four strategies: "Full cycle" implementation of the Women, Peace and Security (WPS) and Sustaining Peace agenda by providing technical and advocacy support to develop National Action Plans, their costing and budgeting, implementation and monitoring; Bringing the voices of local women and civil society to global policy forums; Empowering young women to become leaders in peacebuilding and sustaining peace; and Ensuring adequate and predictable funding for WPS Resolutions' implementation.

Description

The Peacebuilding Communications Intern will be required to:

- Provide support in maintaining GNWP's online branding through social media, website upkeep and podcast production;
- Support the Communications Coordinator as co-chair of the Communications Taskforce for the Global Coalition on Youth, Peace and Security;
- Support in coordinating with GNWP's Junior Peacebuilding Influencers around the world;
- Assist with online promotion of GNWP events and activities;
- Communicate with GNWP members around the world and assist with online campaigns showcasing their work;
- Represent GNWP in meetings and other events at the UN or those organized by the UN, Member States, civil society and academic institutions in New York as assigned by the Communications Coordinator and/or as agreed upon by the GNWP International Coordinating Team;
- Provide support in the promotion of various programs and projects related to the advocacy for the effective implementation of UNSCR 1325, 1820, 2250 and the supporting resolutions on Women and Peace and Security (WPS) and Youth, Peace and Security (YPS);
- Actively engage on social media platforms where GNWP is active (Twitter; Facebook; Instagram) showcasing both in country-level programmatic work and global events relevant to GNWP and its partners;

- Assist in preparations for the UN 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence in November-December, the 6th Anniversary of the UN Security Council Resolution 2250 in December, the United Nations High-Level Political Forum on the Sustainable Development Goals in July, and the 22nd Anniversary of the UN Security Council Resolution 1325 in October;
- Assist in organizing events and other activities in New York or provide support remotely in GNWP's program implementation in other countries; and
- Work in a supportive, inclusive atmosphere.

Qualifications

- Undergraduate studies in Media Studies, Mass Communication, Communication Arts, Journalism, Peace Journalism (ongoing or recent) or equivalent certificate in media and communications;
- Background/interest in global affairs, public policy and advocacy, and gender studies;
- Particular interest in implementing global policies and international laws at the national and local levels; to national and community level and amplifying the voices of grassroots women at the global level;
- Stellar writing and oral skills;
- A self-starter with the ability to keep deadlines and commitments;
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Proficiency in French, Spanish and/or Arabic language an asset; and
- A creative outlook, enthusiasm and a fresh perspective.

GNWP will pay transportation costs of the Peacebuilding Communications Intern if working in NYC (if public health guidelines permit) and will also cover travel and accommodation expenses if the intern participates in organizing meetings and trainings overseas (if public health guidelines permit).
